LIQUOR STORE REGULATIONS

1. In these regulations,

"designated liquor store" means a liquor store designated as a liquor store for the purposes of these regulations, by order of the Commissioner; (*magasin d'alcool désigné*)

"liquor store operator" includes any person employed in a designated liquor store; (*exploitant de magasin d'alcool*)

"prescribed period" means a period prescribed under section 2; (période réglementaire)

"purchase book" means a purchase book or card issued or maintained by a designated liquor store; (*journal des achats*)

"unit" means a unit of liquor prescribed under section 2. (unité) R-023-2014,s.2.

2. (1) The Commissioner, in his or her absolute discretion, may, by order, designate a liquor store in any community as a designated liquor store for the purposes of these regulations.

(2) When the Commissioner, by order, designates a liquor store under this section, he or she shall, in the same order, prescribe the amounts of beer, wine or liquor that comprise a unit for the purposes of these regulations as applied to the designated liquor store.

(3) When the Commissioner, by order, designates a liquor store under this section, he or she may, in his or her absolute discretion, in the same order, establish provisions for consolidated purchases of liquor.

(4) When the Commissioner, by order, designates a liquor store under this section, he or she shall indicate whether the unit allowed under section 4 is to be for a one day period or for a one week period.

3. (1) Subject to these regulations, no person shall purchase or attempt to purchase liquor at a designated liquor store unless using a purchase book to do so.

(2) Subject to these regulations, no designated liquor store operator shall sell or attempt to sell liquor unless it is to a person using a purchase book.

4. (1) Subject to these regulations, no person shall purchase or attempt to purchase, at a designated liquor store, any quantity of liquor, in the prescribed period, that is in excess of one unit.

(2) Subject to these regulations, no designated liquor store operator shall sell or attempt to sell any quantity of liquor, in the prescribed period, that is in excess of one unit.

5. (1) Purchase books shall be made available at any designated liquor store.

(2) Purchase books under these regulations shall remain available in the designated liquor store to assist designated liquor store employees in administering these regulations. R-023-2014,s.3.

6. A person may purchase his or her unit or units by mail, subject to the designated liquor store operator being satisfied that it is a *bona fide* purchase.

7. Nothing in these regulations prohibits the holder of a licence, issued under the *Liquor Act* or regulations made under the Act, from purchasing the liquor necessary for the proper exercise of privileges granted by the licence.

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
