WORKERS' COMPENSATION FORM REGULATIONS

The Minister, under section 212 of the *Hamlets Act* and every enabling power, makes the annexed *Workers' Compensation Form Regulations*.

- 1. The certificate of compliance with the *Workers' Compensation Act* required by section 112 of the *Hamlets Act* must be in accordance with the Schedule.
- 2. The Minister may, for the purposes of the Act,
 - (a) approve the form that is described in the Schedule; and
 - (b) include on the form any additional instructions for the benefit of those who are filling out the form.
- 3. The Workers' Compensation Form Regulations, R.R.N.W.T. 1990,c.H-37, are repealed.
- 4. These regulations come into force on the later of October 1, 2024, and the day on which these regulations are registered by the Chief Legislative Counsel under the *Legislation Act*.

SCHEDULE

(Sections 1 and 2)

- 1. The form for the certificate of compliance with the *Workers' Compensation Act* must
 - (a) provide for the following information to be entered:
 - (i) the name of the business licence applicant,
 - (ii) a certification by the individual signing the certificate that, as at the date of the business licence application, the business for which the business licence application is made is in compliance with the *Workers' Compensation Act* and the applicant
 - (A) has paid all its assessments under the *Workers'*Compensation Act that have become due in respect of that business; or
 - (B) is not required to pay assessments under the *Workers'*Compensation Act in respect of that business,
 - (iii) the reason for which the applicant is not required to pay assessments under the *Workers' Compensation Act* in respect of the business for which the business licence application is made, if the individual signing the certificate certifies that the applicant is not required to pay assessments in respect of that business,
 - (iv) the name and signature of
 - (A) the individual, or one of the individuals, signing the business licence application, or
 - (B) the individual submitting the business licence application, if the business licence application does not require a signature; and
 - (b) include an instruction that any questions regarding compliance with the *Workers' Compensation Act* may be directed to the Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission.

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
